As most of you know our club depends on the money we make each year by helping people get their hunting rifles sighted in for deer hunting season. We do this for four days before opening day of rifle season and it's this income that allows us to be able to afford to host the National Territorial Rifle and Pistol Matches in the State of Michigan.

Normally one of our busiest days during Sight In Days is the day before opening day. This year we had rain most of the day on the 14th of November so our attendance was slightly down as compared to previous years. We usually consider helping our customers get three-hundred guns

sighted in as having a real good year. We charge six dollars a gun and we supply the shooting benches, sand bags, spotting scopes and someone to spot your shots for you.

That equates to about eighteen-hundred dollars on a good year and even though our attendance was down to about two-hundred-twenty-five this year we will still be able to afford to host the Territorial Matches next year. Of course that will depend on the vote at our December meeting but from all indications it looks like our club will end up hosting those matches again next year. Check Ron's 2025 state shoot schedule when it comes out to see how our club members vote on this issue.

Last year's Territorial Matches put a little over four-hundred dollars in our treasury so we called that a success. Of course that's not enough to sustain our club over the course of the next year but my guess is that we'll continue to do this until we go broke.

Through the winter months our club becomes inactive but with each coming of spring comes a renewed interest in shooting and other outdoor sports.

Last summer Cowboy and Mooner joined our club just so they could have a place to come up and camp out for free over the 4th of July weekend. They like to be up here during all the festivities and from all indications they had a good time camping out on our range. This might be something for other people to consider doing. You'd be camping with old friends and, who knows, some informal shooting competition might break out among the campers.
